
















Science Key knowledge to be transferred to long term memory		
	As scientists, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	In the winter it is usually cold, and some trees will have lost their leaves. In the summer it is usually hot, and some trees are green.	In Reception, you used your senses to explore the seasons. You learnt that there are four seasons.
	The weather changes in different seasons of the year. It is hotter and drier in summer. It is colder and wetter in the winter.	In Reception, you observed changes all around you, like ice melting and rainbows appearing.
	In the winter, we wear hats, coats and gloves because it is cold. In the summer, we wear clothes that are made of thinner fabrics.	In Reception, you learnt about keeping safe in the sun by wearing sunscreen and a sunhat.
	Weather forecasting is a prediction of what the weather will be like in the near future.	In Reception, you learnt about the different types of weather. e.g. sunny, rainy and windy.

	An animated story is where pictures can move to make a story. An animated story can have sound and pictures.	In Reception, you used Louis the puppet to create your own stories.

	Exercise and spending time outdoors keeps our bodies and mind healthy.	In Reception, you recycled junk materials to create models and collages.
	Some people reuse old items for something new. This is called recycling, e.g. used glass bottles can be recycled to make new glass bottles. Recycling is good for the environment.

	As designers, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	Different lines can be drawn to create art. e.g. straight, wavy, crosshatch and dotted. Texture can be created on a drawing by using different drawing materials.	In Reception, you used crayons and felt tips to draw 2D shapes.

	As musicians, we will learn about:	You will remember:
	Listening is very important. You listen with your ears and sometimes you can feel sound in your body.	In Reception, you listened to music and learnt how to respond by playing musical instruments.
